



We learned how toys were scarce in her childhood (she only had a teddy- no dolls) because of rationing, so books were her main entertainment and very precious. Some books had very rough edges and black and white drawings because ink and paper were in short supply. The children had a go at drawing some of the front covers of old books. They also got to see some of the toys that Mrs. Ross played with in her childhood....we will leave you to guess which decade that was! It was lovely to hear Mrs. Coley reading one of her childhood favourite stories: The Tale of Peter Rabbit by Beatrix Potter.

On Thursday we had a visitor to Cound class. Sian from Shrewsbury Museum and Art Gallery came to talk to the class about Toys in the Past. This linked to our Uses of Everyday Materials topic in Science and Toys Old and New in History.

We met a character called Josephine from the 1950s who received a toy spinner, a doll called Mary and a knitted cardigan for Christmas.

We looked at dolls from the past. We had to handle the Victorian dolls very carefully as they were made from porcelain. The 1950s doll was a 'walkie talkie.'

We then met a character called George. He was born in 1850. His Christmas present was a lead figure. The figures were passed around in special boxes that we could not open as we learned lead could give us headaches.

Next we had lots of fun playing with toys from the past. There were spinning tops, skittles, Jacob's ladders, whips and tops, cups and balls, kaleidoscopes and swing toys. The staff enjoyed it as much as the children.

After break we were curators. We visited 4 tables containing a wide selection of toys and chose an item to observe and draw.
