Children should know that a cube number is any Key vocabulary number multiplied by itself three times. $|^3 \bigcap$ nxnxn. cube number It can be written as n^3 cube root 2^{3} The first five cube numbers are: power of three | x | x | = |multiply $2 \times 2 \times 2 = 8$ 3 x 3 x 3 = 27 divide $4 \times 4 \times 4 = 64$ product $5 \times 5 \times 5 = 125$

<u>Top tips</u>
